Tax Research/Investigation

- Research: Investigate interesting state taxes.
- Research: Taxes by state (state tax maps: Tax Foundation).
- Research: Current events with 2017 TCJA, many additional changes. Taxes are going to be in the news! Practice paying attention and understand personal impact.
- Research: Deductibility of different types of interest (spoiler... credit card interest is N/D).
- Research: Find tax advice or a planning strategy on social media and determine if it is legitimate.
- History: Research the evolution of e-commerce and effect on sales tax (South Dakota v. Wayfair).
 Discuss the sales tax landscape, what is the future for emerging technology (digital content, digital assets, etc.).
- Data collection: Save receipts and calculate taxes paid by the class in a month.
- Connection: Speaker from local government talk about tax revenue and how spending is allocated.
- Connection: Talk to a small business owner about tax planning and how taxes impact profitability.

Payroll tax

- Employee (W-2) vs independent contractor.
- Federal Insurance Contributions Act (FICA) Social Security and Medicare.
 - Understand why and how these payments are being made.
 - Employee portion and employer portion.
 - Reduce take home pay.
 - Flat rate.
 - Employer submits on employee's behalf.
 - Self-employed (independent contractor) pays self-employment tax.
 - Estimated tax payments or an amount due when filing 1040.
 - Pays the employer and employee portion.
- Research: A project on the funding and eligibility of SS and Medicare.

Income Tax

- Understand filing requirements.
 - https://www.irs.gov/individuals/check-if-you-need-to-file-a-tax-return
 - Gain familiarity with forms, instructions, and publications.
 - Don't forget state requirements.
 - Consider filing if federal or state withholding!

Income Tax

- Understand why we file (FEAR FACTOR).
 - Failure to file and failure to pay penalties.
 - Interest owed if underpaid.
 - Jail time!
 - Statute of limitations.
 - Search for failure to file tax court cases.
 - The IRS generally wins these cases.

Tax Planning

- Traditional IRA vs ROTH IRA
 - Research the differences.
 - Limits change every year, understand why.
 - Tax Deductible (IRA).
 - Tax Deferred (both).
 - Tax Free distributions (ROTH).
 - Create an Excel model showing cash flow distributions.
 - Cross over with savings and investing conversations.
